In case you missed the news, last Friday the Victorian Government announced 16 schools across Victoria would receive funds to upgrade their school buildings. Amazingly for Tarwin Valley PS, we were selected as one of the 16 and will receive a generous \$500,000 to improve and upgrade our school.

performing schools in South Gippsland. The new facilities promise to only enhance our performance and make us an even stronger centre for learning.

SCIENCE & ART

Beeswax Sandwich Wraps

In term one our students focused on waste in both Art and Science. In the Art room students explored how activists used art to express their feelings about waste and litter. In the Science room students were learning about the impact of plastic on our planet. Students collected data on the amount of single use plastic in our lunchboxes at Tarwin Valley Primary School and discovered that we are using over 1000 pieces of plastic a week. These pieces of plastic will be in the ground or oceans for hundreds of years.

Students decided to take action. In Art they designed their own environmental message on a piece of cotton and in Science they dipped this piece of art into melted beeswax from the Blue Tree Honey Farm at Dumbalk.

Students brought home these completed wraps at the end of term 1. Their beautiful beeswax wraps have been carefully made by the students themselves to use instead of glad wrap/ plastic warps in their lunchboxes. After use just wipe down with a damp cloth and dry on the dish rack for the next day. They are re-usable, compost-able and made from Eco-friendly materials. Students will know which one is theirs because they put weeks of work into them, so hopefully they are easier to keep track of than Tupperware lids!!

They may feel stiff on the first few uses but be assured they will soon become easier to manipulate. Please contact Miss Giliam or Ms Lester if you have any questions.
