PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

“Australian education researcher, John Hattie’s, latest update to the Hattie Ranking - which incorporates the results of 1,200 meta analyses - places teacher estimates of achievement as the highest-impact influence on student learning and achievement.”

In short this is **expectations**. Whatever we expect from others in life tends to be what we receive. We are fortunate at Tarwin Valley that many of the staff have been here for some time. Through collaboration we have come to realise that significant amounts of time is spent reinforcing expectations that were set in previous years. Capital letters, full stops and ruling pages are all important items however we shouldn't be still reminding students about them after 5 years or more. As a result, over the coming weeks, students and teachers at Tarwin Valley will be establishing expectations for 2019 and beyond. Many of these expectations already exist in the form of statements, policies and goals but there are others that we believe can have a positive impact on our learning. Expectations will focus on crucial elements that underpin or impact on our learning and sometimes can be overlooked.

To start, teachers will be setting bench-mark expectations for student's skills within different subjects, for example, all Year 2 students can articulate what a syllable is. The chosen expectations will be monitored across the school to ensure consistent practice. Examples of these skills may include workbook and locker presentation, class dialogue and student behaviours. Teachers will regularly monitor these expectations as a group via weekly staff meetings.

As we begin this process, we would appreciate parent input into establishing these basic expectations. If you have any ideas about attitudes and skills that you regard as basic expectations, please add them to the slip at the end of the newsletter and send it back to school. Your input is much appreciated.

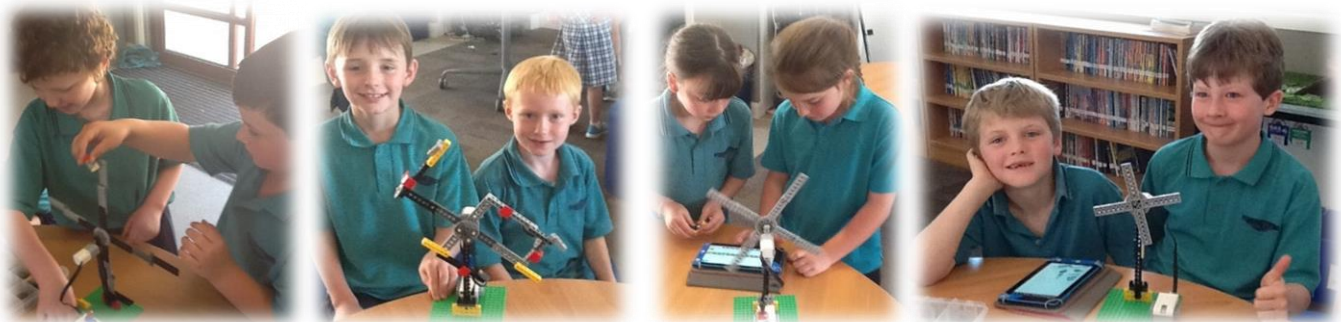
