PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

School holidays have long been a hot topic debated by the general public. Like any opinion, you would hope that a person's view is based on experience or understanding. However, in some cases, it is not. So, to give you a little perspective on school holidays at Tarwin Valley PS I've addressed a few common points.

True: The school holidays are a time for students and teachers to recharge their batteries, try some different experiences and learn in some other ways. Now more than ever, behavioural scientists understand that learning does not occur at a linear rate. The times where we stop, reflect and then reattempt are critical in our learning journey. I strongly encourage all our students and teachers to switch off from school as much as possible. Energized students and teachers = energized classrooms where learning becomes possible.

False: The school holidays are the same for teachers and students. Thankfully, the vast majority of students are able to switch off from school during the holidays. Teachers on the other hand, use their holidays to catch up on professional reading, plan for the following term, restock and reorganise their classrooms and review assessments. We value this time because it allows us to get many jobs completed that would otherwise not be possible during the busy school weeks.

True: Australian students are at school for more days than most schools around the world. In Australia, public schools are mandated to provide 1000 hours (roughly 200 days and five hours per day) of education per year. However, our school days are shorter than the world average. This is partly due to Australia leaving much of the extra-curricular activities in a student's life until after school. In other countries, sport and musical pursuits are often included in a student's typical day.

But, like anything, it is finding the right balance. I hope that your child has found some time over the holidays to follow other healthy pursuits and is re-energized and ready for another wonderful term on their learning journey.

We are looking forward to a large turnout from our school community at the ANZAC Day March tomorrow morning. Students will assemble out the front of the Meeniyan Hall at 9.15am for a 9.30am march. This is a special occasion to many people for many reasons and is highly valued by the school community. CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS

WHAT WE EXPECT AT TARWIN VALLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL

- ❖ Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe.
- ❖ We have zero tolerance of any abuse of children.
- ❖ We have policies and procedures in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children.
- ❖ There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with our students.
- ❖ The new Child Safe Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- ❖ The Child Safe Standards apply to school staff, volunteers, contractors, visitors and students' family members.
- ❖ Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- ❖ We want to ensure you know how we are keeping your children safe at school, and how we would like you to support us.
- ❖ Unsupervised contractors will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working with us if they work with children enrolled in the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school).
