RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS

RU OK? Day - 10th of September 2020

This year even more than others RU Ok? day is timely. The pressure on Australian families has been much higher with COVID, lockdowns, job losses, bushfires on top of regular life stresses.

The Respectful Relationships team had a good discussion about WHEN do we ask someone if they are ok? HOW do we ask someone if they are ok? What do we do if they are not? HOW do we support our students, our parents and our own families if they say "actually, I am not ok"

Mental ill health is not always pretty. It is so painful and tiring for those suffering and also for their families. YET offering an ear, a cuppa, a facetime or a walk is a good start. ASKING them RU OK and then LISTENING with empathy and without judgement. Sometimes just having a chat can make people feel heard, valued and like they matter. Sometimes people need more support and ENCOURAGING them to get help from a professional can change and even save their life.

Finally CHECKING in on them and their loved ones to see how they are travelling reassures people that you still care and you are still there for them.

CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS WHAT WE EXPECT AT MEENIYAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

- ❖ Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe.
- ❖ We have zero tolerance of any abuse of children.
- ❖ We have policies and procedures in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children.
- ❖ There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with our students.
- ❖ The new Child Safe Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- ❖ The Child Safe Standards apply to school staff, volunteers, contractors, visitors and students' family members.
- ❖ Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- ❖ We want to ensure you know how we are keeping your children safe at school, and how we would like you to support us.
- ❖ Unsupervised contractors will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working with us if they work with children enrolled in the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school).
