RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS

Our beloved MARC librarian often finds me a book that she knows I will delight in sharing with my grades or with my children. I love it when she finds me and excitedly describes the book before handing it over, flicking through to find the best illustrations or the paragraph that she knows will hook me in.

This week was no different to any other when she handed me a book filled with photos and quotes from young girls called, "Strong is the New Pretty". I could not wait to flick through this and see what all these strong young humans had to say about themselves.

AND I loved it because one reminded me of my mum. I can't remember my mum ever telling me I was pretty and she really hated the word 'nice'. I can't remember Granny or my dad doing this either, this was not because they did not think I was lovely to look at, it was because they did not think it mattered whether I was pretty or not.

Instead, they told me I was kind, that I had a good imagination, that I was strong, that I was a good sport, that I could saddle up the horse, they praised my compassion for others, they admired my independence and my abilities in the shearing shed. They taught me that clothing and fashion is fun but it is also important to be comfortable, warm and practical.

So often a girl's worth is measured by how pretty and how nice she is. This does not service our girls, instead it keeps them quiet and compliant, valuing themselves on their looks and how the way they look makes others feel.

Let's be mindful of how we praise our girls. Let's notice how strong they are, how wise they are, how compassionate or empathetic they are, how generous they are, how they stick up for themselves or others.

Strong is the new pretty and I LOVE this!

CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS

WHAT WE EXPECT AT MEENIYAH PRIMARY SCHOOL

- ❖ Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe.
- ❖ We have zero tolerance of any abuse of children.
- ❖ We have policies and procedures in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children.
- ❖ There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with our students.
- ❖ The new Child Safe Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- ❖ The Child Safe Standards apply to school staff, volunteers, contractors, visitors and students' family members.
- ❖ Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- ❖ We want to ensure you know how we are keeping your children safe at school, and how we would like you to support us.
- ❖ Unsupervised contractors will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working with us if they work with children enrolled in the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school).
