As a parent, the last few weeks have been extremely difficult for my wife and I. One of our sons was involved in a car accident. Thankfully, he walked away physically unscathed and we pray he is a lot wiser from the experience. The 'What ifs' are horrifying to imagine.

Traumatic events sometimes happen. But what should we do with ourselves when they do? Often, when the next workday comes around, we dust ourselves off in the morning, head out the door to work/school and switch our brain to a different channel. Sometimes this can be a nice distraction while our brains are processing information. It allows us to feel in control and keep going with our busy schedules. However, sometimes our brains aren't happy with this. Sometimes we need to stop. Sometimes we need to take a moment with our loved ones and process everything. Sometimes we just need to listen.

As horrible as the last weeks have been I am thankful to still have my son. I am thankful that this event has allowed us all to grow in different ways and I am hopeful that the experience might save some others.

Growing up isn't easy. We learn much from our parents, school, and other activities but some things we just learn through experience. Hold your kids close, communicate openly with them and listen. The answers are never far away 😊

CAMPS, SPORT & EXCURSIONS FUND – APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for the \$125 (per child) Camps, Sport & Excursions fund. **Please request a form from the school office.** Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child. **If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.**

I thought about how often I do this with my own children and how often I go straight to google to find an ANSWER for them rather than letting them consider, ponder and make a connection to another experience or person.

On Thursday I will be sharing our second Resilience Project video with you on compass – this one will be about gratitude. About noticing the little things. This afternoon I have been reminded to pause and wonder about the little things with my own children. I am grateful to 1 H for bringing this to my attention!

CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS WHAT WE EXPECT AT MEENIYAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

- ❖ Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe.
- ❖ We have zero tolerance of any abuse of children.
- ❖ We have policies and procedures in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children.
- ❖ There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with our students.
- ❖ The new Child Safe Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- ❖ The Child Safe Standards apply to school staff, volunteers, contractors, visitors and students' family members.
- ❖ Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- ❖ To ensure you know how we are keeping your children safe at school, and how we would like you to support us.
- ❖ Unsupervised contractors will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working with us if they work with children enrolled in the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school).


PREVIEW OF LEARNING
