## **RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS**

While listening to a talking book this week I heard the most wonderful phrase. A child was thanking an adult for driving him to all his sport and the driver replied with "It's just turning a wheel mate, nothing to it". The author said that later in life, whenever someone thanked him for a lift he used the same phrase "It's just turning a wheel mate, nothing to it".

I reflected on my response to my own kids after driving EVERYWHERE for swimming, netball, music, music festivals, late night party pick-ups and more. I can assure you at times it has not been as graceful as the author of the book. If the kids squabble in the car or complain it is often met with a sarcastic whine from me "thanks mum, thanks for driving me everywhere, thanks for the hot chips and gravy mum, thanks for paying for all the swimming and my bathers...etc" and it turns into a lecture. I see the kids zoning out 10 seconds in.

After hearing the phrase "It's just turning a wheel mate, nothing to it" I have reflected. It is just a wheel on a car that I am VERY grateful to have, to drive my boisterous and wild children whom I adore around and to watch them participate in a sport and club which they love.

All I am doing is turning a wheel, but I blessed with hours and moments with my children in the car, to find out about their days, to ponder on the big things, to put the back seats down for extras, to bop along to interesting playlists, to listen to talking books and to sing at the top of our lungs.

If you are carting your child around anywhere – it is a fantastic time to talk with them. The eye contact goes, and the listening seems to happen easier. While I can assure you that many drives with my children have been chaotic and stressful other trips in the car have been where problem solving and connection has happened.

Keep turning those wheels!!

## CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS WHAT WE EXPECT AT MEENIYAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

- ❖ Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe.
- ❖ We have zero tolerance of any abuse of children.
- ❖ We have policies and procedures in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children.
- ❖ There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with our students.
- ❖ The new Child Safe Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- ❖ The Child Safe Standards apply to school staff, volunteers, contractors, visitors and students' family members.
- ❖ Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- ❖ To ensure you know how we are keeping your children safe at school, and how we would like you to support us.
- ❖ Unsupervised contractors will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working with us if they work with children enrolled in the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school).

Community members are encouraged to raise any concerns about child abuse with the Principal or report directly to Child Protection / Police.

After a crazy couple of weeks, we are happy to say that things are starting to finally calm down. Since last week we have had more parents/guardians and their children interested in the Before and After School Care Program. Last week the children enjoyed small activities like making stress balls with flour and balloons, mindfulness colouring, puzzles, painting and Lego. As well as a very intense game of tag and learning different ways to play with hula hoops. For a specialist activity on Tuesday afternoon, we had our first basketball session with Mackenzie from Gippsland United, where the children got to learn and practise their basketball skills such as shooting, dribbling and passing.

In Week 4 we will be incorporating more of the children's suggestions, with cooking and outdoor activities planned. We are also upping our game with the menu 😊, this week alongside our usual fruit platter we are offering the kids toasties, spaghetti bolognese and banana muffins (which are being made by the children Friday afternoon). Outdoor activities are also going to include Marshmallow Tiggy, Frisbee Flip and soccer. For more information on our weekly program please feel free to stop by and check out our information board.

A few reminders for parents/guardians to look out for:

- Please be aware that parents/guardians must book their child in before the session starts. This is so that we as educators can better plan the sessions for the children and cause minimal disruption.
- Also, we would like to introduce a hot breakfast for the Before School Care kids every Tuesday starting from the 1<sup>st</sup> of March from 7:30 – 8:00 am. We will be serving scrambled eggs, hot toast and baked beans to start off with. It is small events like this where parents/guardians must make sure that their children are booked in prior to the session. We hope to see the children there and look forward to starting this new weekly moment.
- Another reminder about our weekly Tuesday afternoon specialist activity with Mackenzie from Gippsland United, who is teaching the children to learn and practice their basketball skills like shooting, dribbling and passing as well as having enormous fun. We really hope to see more children attend this!

We look forward to another exciting week with the children!
