PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Some big changes are afoot.

Earlier this year, teacher unions and the Victorian Government agreed upon a new bargaining agreement for teaching staff. Within this agreement was one major change we have not had to consider before – time in lieu (TIL). From the beginning of 2023, teaching staff will be entitled to TIL for any extra hours they do outside their normal 38 hours. Times where this will occur include camps, excursions, school concerts, Parent, Student, Teacher Interviews and School Council meetings.

I will be meeting with our staff before the end of 2022 to consult and ratify a plan for when they will be taking their time in lieu. There are two main issues that will need to be worked through. The first is time with students. Obviously, teachers want to spend as much time with their students as possible and we will have to work out appropriate times where we can minimise the impact on student learning ie. Taking the TIL at quieter times in the term. The second involves planning school events. Schools receive minimal compensation to fund this TIL and will need to be smart with how we plan and organise events. Events such as Parent Teacher Interviews will need to take place within the teachers work hours to avoid more TIL.

This is fair compensation as teachers already spend large amounts of time planning and correcting outside their paid hours. I believe we can find common ground where everyone will be treated justly and the best outcome met for all. As a school community, I wanted to start making you aware of these upcoming changes so you will have an understanding of why the change may be occurring.

My middle daughter had a little stack on the netball court this weekend, which meant we had to go to Wonthaggi for an x-ray on her hand. We were in the emergency room for about 4 hours and she came home plaster free! 4 hours in E.D can feel pretty long – we did not bring books with us so we had to entertain ourselves as best we could as the room filled up but ever so slowly emptied throughout the day.

In those 4 hours I was reminded of something really important – this: People are really kind and generous. People do not have to be, when they are feeling terrible, sitting on an uncomfortable chair with a busted-up hand or foot or some other illness but they are. People smiled at each other and throughout the day there was warm and kind conversations bubbling in the waiting room.

One of the staff had been working 2 jobs over the previous 72 hours but every time he talked to a kid he got down on his knees and connected with each kid. Another noticed people were cold and offered blankets, explaining why the heat could not be turned up.

The whole world is understaffed right now, our schools, our hospitals, our cafes and our supermarkets but one does not have to look very long to see people being kind, empathetic and helpful to each other. Seriously, if you have not noticed – take a look, there are really ace people all about right now! How lucky are we!

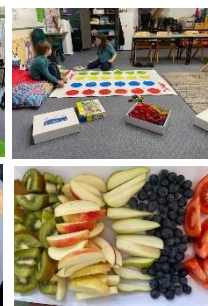
A few reminders for parents/guardians:

CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS WHAT WE EXPECT AT MEENIYAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

- ❖ Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe.
- ❖ We have zero tolerance of any abuse of children.
- ❖ We have policies and procedures in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children.
- ❖ There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with our students.
- ❖ The new Child Safe Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- ❖ The Child Safe Standards apply to school staff, volunteers, contractors, visitors and students' family members.
- ❖ Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- ❖ To ensure you know how we are keeping your children safe at school, and how we would like you to support us.
- ❖ Unsupervised contractors will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working with us if they work with children enrolled in the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school).
