### **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**

Learning takes on many forms and comes in so many different ways. I wanted to share some of the learning that has already taken place within the first two weeks of this term.

The first one is swimming. Our Prep-2 students were fantastic last week completing their four days of swimming. The learning that takes place for them is not just in the pool, but also with the getting organised before and after it. Different routines, buses to catch and clothes to remember are a few of the many things they all had to work out and learn about last week. Now our 3-6 students are in the middle of their swimming lessons this week. Swimming also provides opportunities to try new and different things, or conquer some fears and unknowns. A brilliant opportunity to build resilience.

The second form of learning is the obvious one, student learning. In maths, all students across our school spent the first two weeks learning about ways to interpret and represent data, as well as touching on Place Value concepts each day. It has been great to see the students challenged in different ways, such as how to create a specific question that allows them to find the data they are looking for, before representing that data in a clear and purposeful way.

Lastly, it is our teacher learning. Our staff are all learning about many things at the moment, with particular focus on maths. So far this term we have been embedding new ways to plan and prepare for teaching and learning, then evaluating the impact that is having on our students.

Along with this, staff are digging deep into the curriculum to ensure we are interpreting it as thoroughly and consistently as we can, to ensure the best learning outcomes for our students. This deep dive into our curriculum will be the building blocks for our staffs future learning, where we are excited to extend our focus into maths even further.

I only had a little tear in my eye as she sprinted off towards the end, without looking back and another little tear of relief when I saw her sunny little face waiting for her old mum at the finish line.

WHAT WE EXPECT AT MEENIYAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

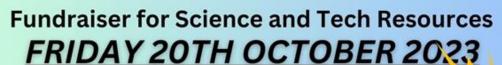
- **!** Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe.

- ❖ We have policies and procedures in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children.
- There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with our students.
- The new Child Safe Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- The Child Safe Standards apply to school staff, volunteers, contractors, visitors and students' family members.
- Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- ❖ To ensure you know how we are keeping your children safe at school, and how we would like you to support us.
- ❖ Unsupervised contractors will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working with us if they work with children enrolled in the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school.

Students will be seated in their house areas and will be able to join you for morning tea and lunch if you are able to attend. If your child goes home with you at the end of the sports, please notify the class teacher.

### WHAT IF?





If the weather is unkind to us, it will mean a cancellation of the event. We will take the weather and the forecast into account and make a staff decision at 8.30am. <u>Please</u> do not phone the school before 8.30am, we will post a News Item on 'Compass'. If the weather on the day is hot,

the day's program will be modified. If you are unsure, send your children to school (prepared for the athletics and/or a normal school day) so that they will be ready if the sports go ahead.
