#### **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**

Change is always filled with mixed emotions. Undertaking the different timetable trial over the past two weeks has opened our eyes to different possibilities and at the same time, presented us with a range of different challenges. We now need to switch back to our original timetable to get a bearing on what aspects of both systems worked best for us all. The trial has shown us the following:

#### Positives:

- The general consensus amongst the teachers has been that the students are more settled with less lost time due to transitions. They also felt that students were more engaged in their learning.
- Specialist teachers have loved the fact they get mini breaks in between classes and feel better prepared for each lesson.
- Playground issues have reduced due to the more regular shortened recess breaks...basically less time for things to go awry.

#### Negatives:

- The shortened 15 minute recesses make it very difficult to catch up
  with a student or colleague, have a snack, go to the bathroom and have
  a rest. Over the two weeks, teachers have employed a range of little
  time savers which has helped.
- Similar to the last point, certain yard duties mean staff have either no break or a whole school day with no rest of more than 15-20 minutes. This is fairly tiring when you have 20 odd students under your guidance for the rest of the day.

We will conduct a proper review of the trial timetable with staff and students in the weeks ahead before making any permanent changes to our timetable going forward.

#### **Toilets**

Finally, the new student toilets will be installed over the summer holidays. This process will begin on Monday December 18<sup>th</sup> when they remove our current student toilet block. We need to get this head start for the new toilets to be completed for the start of the 2024 school year. As I wrote a few weeks back, normal classes, class parties and student reports will all wrap-up by Friday December 15<sup>th</sup>. We understand there may be some students still attending school on December 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>, but hopefully not too many as these students will need to use the staff toilets for these two days.

#### **2024 CURRICULUM CONSUMABLES**

They dragged her out of the cocoon she had created in her room and laid in the sun giggling on the trampoline while I cooked dinner and wiped some tears of relief of my cheeks.

My daughter is home from Hobart this week so last night we had an early 21<sup>st</sup> birthday dinner for her and at the last minute she invited the same 3 girls (now women) to our family dinner and they fell into their lifelong conversation, with lots of laughter and love.

# CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS WHAT WE EXPECT AT MEENIYAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

- Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe.
- ❖ We have zero tolerance of any abuse of children.
- ❖ We have policies and procedures in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children.
- ❖ There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with our students.
- The new Child Safe Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- ❖ The Child Safe Standards apply to school staff, volunteers, contractors, visitors and students' family members.
- ❖ Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- ❖ To ensure you know how we are keeping your children safe at school, and how we would like you to support us.
- Unsupervised contractors will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working with us if they work with children enrolled in the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school.

Community members are encouraged to raise any concerns about child abuse with the Principal or report directly to Child Protection / Police.

























# The Colour Splatacular Fun Run Is Back!

Dear parents and carers,

On Friday 15<sup>th</sup> December Meeniyan Primary School will be hosting the most colourful day of the year.

The Colour Splatacular Fun Run is an <u>opt out</u> event. This is a whole school event where parents and carers are encouraged to come along to enjoy the fun and volunteers are most welcome.

An obstacle course will be constructed on the school oval and students will need to negotiate their way through the course via colour powder shooting stations and sliming galore from our colourful volunteers. For waiting participants, a round robin of activities will be held nearby.

All measures have been taken to ensure this event is safe for all students. However, if your child has a skin or respiratory issues parent/carers should consider their participation carefully. The colour powder is made up of 98 per cent corn starch and 2 per cent food colouring; making it non-toxic, biodegradable and gluten free. The water-based slime is very safe and non-irritating for skin and eyes. Staff will do their best to aim the colour powder and slime toward the torso. However, ducking into incoming powder and slime, or wind, may cause it to land onto your child's face or hair. Sunglasses are encouraged and are available for \$5.00. Ingredient listings and toxicology risk assessments are available from the office at school.

On the day of the Fun Run students are asked to wear a plain white T Shirt along with any other clothes suitable for getting really messy in on the day. **T Shirts are also available for purchase for \$5.00 each. See the attached order form for sunglasses and T Shirt's.**

#### **FREE INSTRUCTION**

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free
  access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the
  standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

#### **PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS**

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



#### **Curriculum Contributions**

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

# Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

# Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



#### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



#### SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.


