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PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Last week a colleague with close to 40 years' experience teaching in schools made an interesting observation, 'You know, I don't recall in all my years teaching a time when students had days off school because of natural disasters and the power going out....yet in the last few years this has happened twice!' And if we throw in the COVID interruptions, we have certainly had a different landscape to adjust to in recent years.

I want to use today's report to outline the school's position in case we have any blackouts/natural disasters in the future:

- Communication where possible, a staff member will get a message out on Compass to alert families as to our next steps. Regardless of communications, the school is generally kept open for those who need it unless there are safety issues with the school. Even if the school is kept open, we would like families to consider the needs of their child. Students with serious medical conditions should not be at school when communications are down as the risks are too great.
- 2. Buses Like the school remaining open, buses will continue to operate whilst it is safe to do so. We were fortunate, that roads around Meeniyan were cleared relatively quickly. If the buses cannot operate, our bus service or the school will contact affected families.
- 3. Learning after these events we weigh up who is at school and adjust our learning accordingly. Last week, we ran a modified program for the 20 or so students who attended. The modified program often combines students from different classes ie Prep-2, 3/4 and 5/6; and students enjoy a mixture of fairly general reading, writing and maths activities. Teachers pause their normal program until school returns to normal or the majority of students are back.
