I spent last weekend poolside at the Gippsland Championships swim meet in Traralgon. Swimming is one of those sports that is very exciting to watch but it can be over in half a minute and then a parent can wait half a day to watch their kid swim again! Luckily it is also a perfect opportunity for fabulous conversations and observations of grit, resilience, good sportsmanship and fun.

While sitting poolside I was talking to one of our younger swimmers who is a firecracker of a kid. She is usually bubbling around talking, cracking jokes and even adding in a wink or two. But this day it was backstroke day she was flat as a tack and feeling sick in the tummy- she was confused to why she was feeling this way.

Her mum was all over it, giving her an icy pole, a cuddle and encouraged her to go and marshal for her backstroke so she shuffled off for her swim. And what a swim! This little firecracker shot down the pool – sprinting out the last part of her backstroke with the confidence and strength of someone who had been swimming for years.

She came back to the grandstand from her swim and proudly announced that she had solved her problem. CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS WHAT WE EXPECT AT MEENIYAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

- Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe.
- ❖ We have zero tolerance of any abuse of children.
- ❖ We have policies and procedures in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children.
- There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with our students.
- ❖ The new Child Safe Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- The Child Safe Standards apply to school staff, volunteers, contractors, visitors and students' family members.
- Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- ❖ To ensure you know how we are keeping your children safe at school, and how we would like you to support us.
- Unsupervised contractors will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working with us if they work with children enrolled in the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school.
