From there, we will come up with 2/3 key areas we would like to see improvement in as a school and monitor that progress through leadership walks. This could be anything from student focus and engagement during maths, to how our students are being challenged day to day. This will

link with the George Telford work our school has been completing the past few years, and the refresher we completed early this term.

Another key area of focus from the George PD is that of questioning, and how questioning can challenge students thinking and learning. During classroom observations some staff have been looking, in detail, at the types of questions they ask during a typical maths lesson and the impact they are having on student learning. From here, staff are then deliberately planning questions they want to ask during a maths session. For the next couple of weeks we will be monitoring how these questions are adding challenge to students learning across classrooms.

#### AUSTRALIAN EARLY DEVELOPMENT CENSUS

The AEDC is a government initiative that measures developmental progress of children as they start their first year of full time school and reports on groups of children, not individuals. Claire Guy, our Prep teacher will soon be completing this census via the Australian version of the Early Development Instrument which collects data relating to the five key areas of childhood development as listed below: (children do not need to be present, teachers used the AvEDI to record their observations)

Physical health and wellbeing

- Social competence
- Emotional maturity
- Language and cognitive skills (school based)
- Communication skills and general knowledge

The results are used to help plan and allocate the right type of services, resources and support for families and communities. Participation is voluntary so if you wish to opt-out of the census, please contact either Claire Guy or the school office.

#### **RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS**

Last weekend I ran a marathon. I am not sharing this story to brag about the run but want to share it because of what was happening in my head and who put it in there. In the build up to the run I was joking that I may perish somewhere between the lighthouse and Roaring Meg or would have to walk in late at night with a torch as I had over estimated my ability. I was talking myself down because I was not feeling confident and did not really believe I could do this.

Over the week before the run, my friends said things like 'you are fitter than you have ever been', 'you have trained so hard' and Andrew said 'you get really determined (stubborn) when you say you are going to do something – you will finish it just because you said'. These words stayed in my head – as did good things people had told me about myself over the years 'Donna you are really brave' 'Donna you can do hard things' 'Donna you are resourceful and can make fun in any situation'. 

#### CHILD SAFETY STANDARDS WHAT WE EXPECT AT MEENIYAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

- Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe.
- We have zero tolerance of any abuse of children.
- We have policies and procedures in place to protect the care, safety and welfare of children.
- There are clear boundaries about how adults in our school community may interact with our students.
- The new Child Safe Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past.
- The Child Safe Standards apply to school staff, volunteers, contractors, visitors and students' family members.
- Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility.
- To ensure you know how we are keeping your children safe at school, and how we would like you to support us.

Unsupervised contractors will be asked about their child safety arrangements as a condition of working with us if they work with children enrolled in the school (or children can reasonably be expected to be present while they are at the school.

### The 2024 Australian Early Development Census

# **Every school counts**

The Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) is a national data collection of early childhood development at the time children commence their first year of full-time school.

Since 2009, communities, schools and governments across Australia have used results from the AEDC to help provide the right kind of services, resources and support for children and families.

Teachers of children in their first year of full-time school will complete online training prior to completing the Australian version of the Early Development Instrument (AvEDI) for children in their class. Data collection will take place from May 2024 and school results will be available from late 2024. Individual children are not identifiable in the results. Your school's participation in the AEDC helps to build a more complete picture of the health, wellbeing and development of children in the community. By taking part in the AEDC, you will be contributing important information that can assist other schools and the entire community to better support children and their families to be ready for school.

Every school counts and it's through the commitment of all schools that the AEDC is a success. Thank you for playing your part in the AEDC data collection.
